

## **River Bend Gun Club 2016 Light Rifle Championship**

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### **Overview**

Each season, River Bend Gun Club members are eligible to compete for the title of **Light Rifle Champion and Junior Light Rifle Champion**.

The **Light Rifle Champion** and the **Junior Light Rifle Champion** are the winners of the final match of the season, with the match winner taking Club Champion honor and the winner of the Junior Class becoming the Junior Champion. There will be no official recognition for any other shooter other than for the member and junior member with the highest totals.

The names of the Light Rifle Champion and Junior Light Rifle Champion will be inscribed on the permanent championship trophy which remains in possession of the club and displayed in the RBGC conference center. The Champion and Junior Champion will also receive a permanent memento of their respective accomplishment (plaque, trophy, or medal).

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### **Championship Rules**

#### **1. Eligibility**

- 1.1. The club championship is limited to River Bend Gun Club members in good standing.
- 1.2. Championship contenders for the Junior class must meet age eligibility as defined by the NRA classification system.

#### **2. Championship Criteria**

- 2.1. The Championship match will be the final match of the season and will be held in October.
- 2.2. The Championship match will be a 60 shot, any sight fired at 50 feet.
- 2.3. The **RBGC Light Rifle Champion** is the RBGC member who fires the highest score in the Championship Match.
- 2.4. The **RBGC Junior Light Rifle Champion** is the RBGC junior member who fires the highest score in the Championship Match.

#### **3. Challenges, Protests, Ties And Requests For Championship Rule Clarifications**

- 3.1. Ties, protests and requests for championship rule interpretation or clarification are addressed and resolved by a 3-member *Championship Jury*.
  - 3.1.1. The RBGC Light Match Director is the Championship Jury Chairman.
  - 3.1.2. Jury members are appointed, replaced, and/or substituted at the discretion of the Championship Jury Chairman.
- 3.2. Challenges, protests or requests for interpretation or clarification of rules or any issue not covered by these rules must be submitted in writing to the Championship Jury Chairman.
- 3.3. The Championship Jury will be convened by the Championship Jury Chairman as soon as practical following receipt of a written challenges, protests, etc.

3.4. Championship Jury decisions are communicated in writing to the originator and others who, in the judgment of the jury, may be affected by or have an interest in the decision.

3.5. Championship Jury decisions are final and no further appeals are available.

#### **4. Championship Ties**

4.1 **Tie Breaker:** In the event that a match winner cannot be determined using the small bore rules, the tie will be broken by a coin toss conducted by a member of the *Championship Jury*.
