RANGE RULE REMINDER OF THE MONTH

Many times throughout the Range Rules, and in nearly every range description is the admonition of "rounds striking the back berm". Sometimes, this takes a bit of geometry to ensure this happens.

Some of the range floors rise towards the back of the berm. When your target stand is close to the front of the range/bay—even with proper target position and height on the stand itself, rounds could strike the range floor.

The 4th Universal Rule of Gun Safety states "Know your target and what is beyond it"

Please visualize your rounds after they pass through the target and ensure they strike the back berm.

This simple act helps preserve the range floor, reduce ricochets and keeps everyone at River Bend *safe*!

River Bend Gun Club is seeking qualified candidates for the Assistant Club Manager position. The current Assistant Club Manager is retiring in June of 2023. In order to meet training needs and to support near term staff augmentation requirements, the club would like to fill this position as soon as feasible.

Job Description

The Assistant Club Manager (ACM) assists the Club Manager in day-to-day operations; however, the primary role is one of membership support and lifecycle management of membership. In this role the ACM reports directly to the Club Manager and coordinates with the CRO team, Club Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Communications Manager, Range Officers, staff, members, and vendors as needed.

This is a full-time position requiring at least 40 hours per week with the requirement to be onsite at least one weekend day per month in support of New Member Orientation (NMO). Additional weekend support may be needed for special events such as the annual Young Shooters Challenge (YSC) or the Annual Business Meeting and Picnic.

Candidates must be an RBGC member in good standing for at least three years and must possess excellent interpersonal, verbal, and written communication skills. Administrative and organizational skills are essential. A basic working knowledge of MS Excel and MS Word is desirable as are any data management skills.

Primary Responsibilities

The ACM is responsible for lifecycle management and support of membership including initial membership inquiries and maintenance of complete and accurate records and archives of membership throughout the life of same. These responsibilities include:

- Acting as the primary point of contact for membership inquiries, facility tours, and membership applications
- Managing membership intake processes, vetting of applications for membership, scheduling of applicants into NMO and post-NMO processing of applicants into membership
- Administration of membership pricing, invoicing, system configuration updates, changes, and reporting as needed
- Updating and managing membership records throughout the lifecycle of membership. Support and resolution of membership related questions or issues for existing members
- Development, coordination, and implementation of the annual membership renewal
- Issuance of membership / staff badges and gate card credentials
- Managing the gate access system, gate credentials, and gate schedules.

Additional Responsibilities

- Accounts Receivables, banking, and deposit reporting
- Accounts Payables as needed
- Payroll Processing
- Employee onboarding processes
- Vendor management
- Coordinating event hospitality services when needed

Position Available—Assistant Chief Range Officer II (ACRO II)

River Bend Gun Club River Bend Gun Club is seeking club members who meet the qualifications for the ACRO II job as described below. This is an hourly position with flexible hours that pays \$18.00 per hour.

Mission Statement: The mission of the Assistant Chief Range Officer II (ACRO II) is to consistently demonstrate a professional and courteous demeanor while representing the club, Club Management and the Board of Directors to members and their guests. The ACRO II is required to support the Chief Range Officer (CRO) and Assistant Chief Range Officer (ACRO) in public relations activities with members and their guests, to patrol the shooting ranges and club property, to ensure that the RBGC Range Rules are adhered to by all members and their guests and to perform assigned administrative duties as required.

Job Duties:

1. Work approximately 40 to 60 hours per month including at least four weekend days and two to three weekdays.
2. Patrol RBGC shooting ranges and club property.
3. Gather all sign in sheets from all ranges monthly.
4. Interface with members and their guests as necessary to answer questions, provide needed information, enforce the Range Rules and provide additional assistance as required.
5. Conduct the physical range tour portion of the New Member Orientation for perspective new members.
6. Conduct Tactical Rifle certification clinics as required.
7. Work as a coach for instructional events such as Women On Target.
8. Prepare written reports of observed and reported rule violations

Job Requirements:

1. Applicants must possess well developed interpersonal skills that enable them to interface with members and their guests in a professional, courteous and friendly manner whether they are offering assistance or are discussing Range Rules violations.
2. Applicants must be mature and levelheaded enough to remain professional when interacting with members and their guests who may become condescending, belligerent, or confrontational.
3. Applicants must possess a thorough understanding of RBGC Range Rules, shooting range operations and must possess a broad working knowledge of different action types and firearms operation.

Organizational Structure: The ACRO II will report directly to the CRO. In addition, the ACRO II is expected to maintain a close working rapport and communication with the ACRO, the Club Manager, the Shotgun Hill Manager, the Club President and members of the Board of Directors.

Resumes must include candidate contact information including an email address and phone number, a description of applicant qualifications, a detailed employment history for the past ten years and a summary of education completed.

Official Club Business

Highlights of the December 12, 2022 Board of Directors Meeting

Vice President Ernie Knoche presided over a quorum of six Board members. Also attending were four club officers, one life member, one annual member, and one life member spouse. The meeting was convened at 7:00PM on Monday, December 12, 2022. The meeting was held at RBGC's Gene Mowell Conference Center on club property.

A quorum was confirmed, the proposed agenda was adopted, the minutes of the November 14, 2022, Board meeting were approved, and the following officer and manager reports were presented and accepted:

Treasurer Secretary Chief Range Officer Club Manager Shotgun Manager

Board decisions made, actions taken, and items of interest:

- David Norcross presented the Treasurer's report and reported that November FYTD income was \$746K, an increase of approximately \$15K versus the same period in FY 2021.
- November FYTD expense was \$435K, a decrease of approximately \$91K versus the same period in FY 2021.
- Cash in the bank as of 11/30/22 was \$495,255 including \$100,220 in Capital Reserve Fund and \$42,360 in Scholarship Fund.
- Club Secretary Erica D'Amico reported that the membership total at the beginning of the December 2022 meeting was 2,233; 81 members more than this time last year.
- The number of Senior Members at the beginning of the December 2022 meeting was 205; 9.18% of RBGC membership and 12 members more than this time last year.
- There were 8 members on the Life Membership Wait List at the beginning of the December 2022 meeting.
- Chief Range Officer James Garner reported that the Range Use Summary Report for November 2022 totaled 1,690 (1,402 members and 288 guests).
- Eleven venues submitted Match Use Summary Reports for November 2022. Total entries were 333 (156 members, 175 non-members, and 2 juniors). November match income was \$3,985.00 with \$900.00 reported to the club.
- There were 8 Tac Rifle Certifications, 0 NFA Certifications, 0 Supergun Certifications, and 0 Stop the Bleed Certifications in November.
- The board approved Scott Hauswirth for USPSA ARO.
- David Norcross presented the Club Manager's report and reported that Cowboy Bay 11 is currently closed pending rehabilitation.
- John Livingstone constructed a club information bulletin board outside the main gate aimed specifically to non-club members. Sign will be coroplast construction with RBGC graphics.
- LED lighting was installed on AP4.
- Kings II serviced the MP2 callbox and replaced the speaker.
- Gutters were repaired on MP2.
- Cowboy Bays 9 and 10 plate racks were aligned and leveled to mitigate splash, spalling, and ricochets.
- Big Dee's in Dawsonville has provided a quote for the 2023 Club Business Meeting and Picnic. The catering service is identical to last years' and will be \$6,042.52.
- The Board approved \$2,660 to replace insufficient bare copper ground in the Clubhouse.
- The Board approved \$450 to replace the Skeet Shoot Box.
- Shotgun Hill Manager Bill Wettingfeld reported that shotgun range use in November 2022 was 277 shooters (194 members and 33 guests). 1,009 rounds were fired during November with 18 cart rentals. Total November revenue to the club was \$7,708.00.

- Member Communications Manager David Norcross reported that the December Bullet-IN reached 2,318 recipients with 2,312 successful deliveries (97.7%). Open rate was 1,602 (69.3%) and 644 (27.9%) members clicked through the newsletter.
- The Board approved 10 new members and 0 reinstatements.
- The Board approved the proposed 2023 Range Rules Revisions.

Regular monthly Board meetings are called to order at 7:00 PM on the second Monday of each month in the Gene Mowell Conference Center. RBGC members and families are cordially invited to attend.

Bench Tech—Chapter 3: The Basis of Ammunition Quality

Due to our country's legal environment, your receipt of this article and any use you make of the information in this article are subject in every respect to the limitations and conditions language at the end of the article.

Chapter 1 introduced the tripod foundation of accuracy: shooter skills, system quality, and ammunition quality. I hope you noted in the narrative the adjective "consistent" was applied to all three.

The bench shooting technique described in Chapter 2 falls under the heading of shooter skills. Skill with this technique is analogous to the skills required in such positions as the high-power prone and the countless combinations of position with attendant rifle support required in a tactical match. The technique described in Chapter 2 presents a consistent way of shooting off a bench that is compatible with producing a consistent and predictable aim point relatively free of wobble or aiming error.

Me now stating that the basis for ammunition quality is its degree of consistency should be considered a statement of the obvious. High-quality, accurate ammunition is directly related to the consistency of its components and preparation, sometimes taken to graduate-level, Sesame Street "same and different".

I believe that the ammunition's contribution to what shows up on the target is the result of complex physics, with pulse and the resultant system vibrations (harmonics) as the operational concepts. A consistent pulse produces consistent system vibrations. Those vibrations can be "tuned" to produce "best available" accuracy, given a selected primer, powder and bullet's interaction with the system. Think of load development using consistent ammunition as tuning a piano or guitar to get "the" tonal pitch.

The firing pin striking the primer results in a time vs pressure curve as the powder ignites. The ignition process with the resultant time vs pressure is the pulse. This pulse produces all manner of vibrations in the system. Additional vibration to the system is caused by the bullet traversing down the barrel. These compound vibrations produce movement (displacement) in the system, most notably in the form of barrel movement. Consistent barrel movement means it spits out the bullet at the same spacial (3-D) point. Allowing the barrel to consistently move without interference in response to these vibrations is the reason for properly bedding the action, free-floating the barrel within the stock, and not allowing anything to touch the barrel as the bullet is being launched.

The most obvious reloading step in achieving a consistent pulse is to have a consistent powder charge, preferably to the nearest 0.1 grain. There are two others: both a uniform bullet seating depth and the degree of brass neck tension (bullet pull). For those of you who are experienced hand loaders, me stating that both powder charge and bullet seating depth adjustments are fundamental methods to tune the system vibrations should come as no surprise. However, I believe the brass prep/maintenance steps associated with the case neck, as presented in subsequent articles, are also important in both achieving a consistent pulse and tuning a load, ones that may not be given focus by the typical ammunition hand loader. Strategic tinkering with the cases' neck tension could be the "secret sauce" necessary to get a load that is teasing you unmercifully to finally "shoot".

Rifle brass is the boiler room in which the pressure to generate the pulse is produced. Making the brass beneficially consistent to produce a consistent pulse through strategic reloading, customizing, and periodic maintenance methods is a prime contributor to any stated accuracy goal. Multiple future Bench Tech articles will fall under the heading of "Brass Preparation". These articles will discuss and present methods for making the brass consistent.

Expect articles on topics such as:

- Methods for Annealing Brass

Bullet uniformity and consistent seating depth also affect the pulse and resultant vibrations in the system. Expect articles on topics such as:

- How to Strategically Seat Bullets
- Basic (and Simple) Bullet Sorting Methods

Some of these methods merely refine the reloading steps you already perform. Some are additional steps in your reloading sequence. I don't consider any of them to be particularly hard or complex, but implementation of some will require purchase of new tools and equipment. I believe all methods presented will contribute to producing a consistent pulse to the system, resulting in a far more linear and predictable load-tuning process. Bottom line: you won't know if you have a "hummer" barrel unless your reloading methods ask it to hum and you call the tune.





