RIVER BEND BALLISTIC CHALLENGE XVI GLOCK MATCH

The 2023 Dawsonville Glock Match was held on the Cowboy Hill Range March 11th & 12th with a total of 642 entries (aka 'pistols shot') for the match. Everyone seemed to understand how Sunday's weather forecast might make it tough on scores –particularly if you were wanting to do well. Saturday was bright and sunny, and the quote "Suns out, Guns out" rang out like gunfire thunder! Sunday's plan to shoot the match became Saturday's battle cry of "let's go, NOW"!

Registration opened early Saturday to allow the Range Officers an opportunity to finish their match from the day before. The in-rush of competitors side-lined that thought right from the start. Soon, Cowboy Hill was awash with shooters signing in and pulling triggers. The Range Officers



and Staff were running up and down the Hill trying to keep ahead of *EVERYONE* wanting to get their entries shot right then!! Lines were long and waiting to shoot got everyone a little anxious. GLOCK, River Bend Range Officers --every volunteer on the Hill kicked in and got the bottlenecks opened. An additional Course of Fire was thrown together in a matter of minutes to address the flood of shooters once the gates opened.

'Time takes time', and the Ballistic Challenge has no sway on the physical laws of time and space —although we really, REALLY try to! A perspective on Saturday: with every CoF running at top speed; 3 plate racks banging and clanking non-stop, shooting was halted by *darkness!!* Time had run out for the remaining shooters on the *day before* daylight savings took effect! Sunday's weather started as predicted: windy with rain. A few braved the elements to get their shots in for score. By mid-morning, the rain ended, and the Sun didn't exactly jump out, but the damage was done with less than 100 entries for the day.



The Young Marines brought a new element to the Ballistic Challenge this year by flipping burgers for everyone's lunch fare. Judging by the compliments received —they hit a home run with the fresh approach, the fresh coffee and the fresh condiments served up for everyone's enjoyment. The Range Officer raffle and prize table giveaways included seven Glock pistol certificates, four certificates for Hunter HD Gold shooting glasses

RANGE RULE REMINDER OF THE MONTH

May 2023

Changes are coming to the River Bend ranges. Just as with AP-4 and AP-5 whose firing line is identified by red stake 4x4s, so it will be made so at every River Bend range possible. From Cowboy Hill and on down the line, red stakes are being placed on both the left and right sides of the range to delineate the firing line for that range.

Depending on the range where the red stakes are placed, the red stakes will mean the absolute end of the allowable shooting area for that range. Meaning that shooting for that range must occur forward of the red stakes and impact directly on the back berm for that range.

As work progresses on Cowboy Hill for Bays 3, 4, and 6, so will the placement of red stakes begin with Cowboy Hill. As the the 4x4 red posts are added to the Cowboy Hill Bays, the CRO team will be placing updated Range Rules booklets specifically addressing that range and its new firing line markers.

The CRO and the CRO Team urge you to look for, and identify, the red 4x4 stakes on the range you are enjoying and understand its meaning and purpose.

Membership Dues Increase Approved for FY 2023-2024

During the Executive Session that followed the monthly Board of Directors meeting on March 13, 2023, the Board voted to approve a 4.55% dues increase for fiscal year 2023-2024. This modest dues increase is necessary for the continued fiscal health of River Bend Gun Club and it will help offset increased costs in fuel, construction materials and labor.

Dues for annual members will increase \$15.00 to \$345 and dues for senior members will increase \$7.50 to \$172.50. This 4.55% increase is consistent with dues increases in FY 22-23 (3.8%), FY 21-22 (3.9%) and in FY 20-21 (2%). Prior to the FY 20-21 increase, the club had not increased dues since 2005 when dues were increased from \$200 to \$300 (50%) and several members allowed their membership to lapse in protest


Based on current membership growth trends, the 4.55% dues increase for FY 23-24 will provide approximately \$32,000 in additional income from dues payments. Significant income is also generated by initiation fees and dues from new members who join RBGC at an average rate of approximately 16 new members per month. Membership dues and initiation fees are the club's primary sources of revenue and, together, they generate a bit less than \$1,000,000 in annual income. Annual operating expenses are approximately \$800,000 and, in any given year, the club has approximately \$180,000 to \$200,000 in "discretionary income" which is used for equipment replacement, paving, range rehabilitation and new range development and construction.

As long as we have incremental dues increases and new member growth, RBGC will continue to operate efficiently and will continue to host shooting venues (matches) and provide multiple ranges for members, their families and guests to safely shoot on and enjoy. Even though the club hosts a robust match schedule on weekends, many ranges are available for member use on weekends and all ranges are generally available for member use on weekdays. Club Management, the Board of Directors, the Club Treasurer and I monitor the club's financial performance closely and adjustments in spending and project time lines are made as necessary to ensure that the club remains financially solvent and debt free.

The attached pie chart shows club expenses broken down into 12 categories for the period July 1, 2022 through March 31, 2023. The club's total expenses for FY 2022-2023 were \$792,157 through March 31, 2023. As of March 31, 2023, the club had \$332,271 in the bank including \$100,224 in the Capitol Reserve Fund (to be used for unforeseen expenses like flood, fire or earthquake damage) and \$42,797 in the Scholarship Fund.

Proxy forms will be emailed to the club membership and will be available for download on the club website after April 1, 2023.

Properly completed and signed proxy forms must be received by the Club Secretary no later than 5PM on Friday, May 12, 2023. Proxies received after that date and time will be rejected. Please remember, if you assign your voting rights to a proxy, the club member you assign your proxy to must be present and signed-in at the annual meeting to vote on your behalf, so please be sure that your assigned proxy is going to attend. Also, to be valid, your proxy must be assigned to a specific individual by name. Proxies left blank or assigned to "Board of Directors" or anything other than an individual name will be disallowed. Any member who authorizes another member to act on their behalf at a specific meeting via proxy may not vote at the meeting specified.

Additional Statement bv Will Owensby

I am a candidate for Club President because I believe in River Bend Gun Club and because a great deal of hard work remains to be done to help this club continue to meet the needs of the members and remain financially strong.

Since I was first elected as Club President in May 2018, I have been fortunate to enjoy the support and cooperation of the Board of Directors and the club's staff and members to accomplish many important projects, expansion of the club's property and membership and consistent financial stability. Since June 2022, the support from several members of the Board of Directors has been sorely lacking and this has reduced my effectiveness as Club President and the effectiveness of the Board as a whole.

The River Bend Gun Club, Inc By-Laws assign specific powers to the Board of Directors. The By-Laws require the Club President to preside at all meetings of the club, the Board and the Executive Committee and they require the Club President to function as Chief Executive Officer, exercising all authority not otherwise delegated or assigned under the By-Laws. Neither the Club President or the Board of Directors has more authority than the other and both the President and the Board must work together to effectively manage club operations and resources. When enough members of the Board pursue an agenda that is not supported by other Board members, the effectiveness of the Board is compromised, important decisions are not agreed to, actions are not initiated and the club and its membership bear the consequences.

Since June 2022, two Life Directors have resigned. One resigned in June because he moved out of state and another in September, for personal reasons. Pursuant to the By-Laws, life members were elected by the Board to serve in their place until the next Annual Business Meeting. Since then, groundless accusations by Board members against one another, inappropriate displays of emotion and blame shifting have been common at Board meetings. Disagreements and hard feelings have been much more common than compromise and a willingness to work together.

The many productive actions accomplished by the various Boards of Directors I presided over prior to June 2022 have remained beneficial for the club and membership and I am confident that these success will continue if more members who truly care more about the club than their own agendas are elected. I ask for your vote for Club President and I ask that you join me in voting for the following Life and Annual Directors to revitalize the Board and help bring the club back onto a path to success.

Kelly Duncan for Life Director

Kelly joined RBGC in 2009. He has served on the Board as a Life Director and, as Vice President during my first term as President in 2018-19, Kelly was one of the few who were instrumental in helping the club purchase the additional 55 acres that expanded total club property to 377 acres. Kelly is competitive in USPSA, IDPA, Hunter Rifle, Multi-Gun, Action Pistol, Cowboy Action, Run and Gun and in Trap, Skeet and sporting Clays.

Michael Hall for Life Director

Michael joined RBGC in 2008. He is a Certified Public Accountant who owns and operates his own accounting firm and he has a firm understanding of the asset management, cash flow and personnel management challenges faced by small businesses. Michael is an advanced collector of S&W revolvers and he is competitive in High Power rifle.

Cliff Buckalew for Annual Director

Cliff joined RBGC in 2007. He recently retired from executive management with GA Power and is ready to bring his years of entrepreneurial business knowledge to the table as an Annual Director. 

Highlights of the March 13, 2023, Regular Board of Directors Meeting

President Will Owensby presided over a quorum of eight Board members. Also attending were the Club Manager, Assistant Club Manager, four club officers, three life members, four annual members, and one life member spouse. The meeting was convened at 6:59PM on Monday, March 13, 2023. The meeting was held at RBGC's Gene Mowell Conference Center on club property.

A quorum was confirmed, the proposed agenda was adopted, the minutes of the February 13, 2023, Board meeting were approved, and the following officer and manager reports were presented and accepted:

Treasurer Secretary Chief Range Officer Club Manager Shotgun Manager

Board decisions made, actions taken, and items of interest:

- Treasurer Geoff Rhines presented the Treasurer's report and reported that February FYTD income was \$827K, a decrease of approximately \$5K versus the same period in FY 2022.
- February FYTD expense was \$702K, a decrease of approximately \$50K versus the same period in FY 2022.
- Cash in the bank as of 2/28/23 was \$373,391 including \$100,223 in Capital Reserve Fund and \$42,787 in Scholarship Fund.
- Club Secretary Erica D'Amico reported that the membership total as of March 11, 2023, was 2,289; 83 members more than this time last year.
- The number of Senior Members as of March 11, 2023, was 206; 8.99% of RBGC membership and 6 members more than this time last year.
- There were 10 members on the Life Membership Wait List at the beginning of the March 2023 meeting.
- Chief Range Officer James Garner reported that the Range Use Summary Report for February 2023 totaled 2,067 (1,674 members and 393 guests).
- Eight venues submitted Match Use Summary Reports for February 2023. Total entries were 242 (97 members, 145 non-members, and 0 juniors). February match income was \$3,870.00 with \$370.00 reported to the club.
- New Member Orientation held on February 26, 2023 for 24 attendees.
- There were 19 Tac Rifle Certifications, 0 NFA Certifications, 0 Supergun Certifications, and 12 Stop the Bleed Certifications in February 2023.
- Bill Goode presented the Club Manager's report and reported that the Manager's office was painted and new lighting installed.
- New concrete steps were installed on Shotgun Hill.
- Replaced switch on 5-stand tower, replaced four non-working outlets on SL range, and repaired CB Bay 4 outlet.
- Damaged target backers replaced on MP1.
- A new PA system was purchased for the Annual Meeting and Picnic.
- Assistant Club Manager Greg Hughes presented the Shotgun Hill Manager's report and reported shotgun range use in February 2023 was 339 shooters (284 members and 55 guests). 1,025 rounds were fired during February with 28 cart rentals. Total February revenue to the club was \$8,227.00.
- Member Communications Manager David Norcross reported that the March 2023 Bullet-IN reached 2,328 recipients with 2,326 successful deliveries (99.9%). Open rate was 1,627 (69.9%) and 718 (30.9%) members clicked through the newsletter.
- The Board approved 20 new members.
- The Board approved to keep 20.74 acres out of conservation status for future development.
- The Board approved \$20,000.00 for another club work truck when one becomes available.

Rimfire Benchrest Match Report

There is only one word to describe the April Rimfire Benchrest match – WINDY – really really windy. Twenty shooters were on-hand for the match with misleading still cool conditions during setup and the safety briefing. The match was run in two approximately equal size relays. As soon as the first relay took the firing line the wind started blowing, with shooters agreeing that it was the worst wind conditions in memory, strong constantly switching conditions.

In the unlimited class, there was little doubt about the outcome, as Grant Toman jumped out to a commanding lead firing an impressive 249-19X, four points ahead of both Simon Bailey and Pat Patterson. Under worsening conditions, Toman posted a 148-19X and a pair of 249's to finish 25 points ahead.

The precision class had seven competitors with Jeff Kitchens using a CZ457 posting a first stage 247-7X ahead of Ken Bowles and his CZ457 and 241-5X effort and Doug McNash using his Anschutz 1613 to fire a 241-5X. Through stages two and three, Kitchens and Bowles suffered from the increasing wind dropping additional points. McNash strengthened his scores, ending on a pair of 246's to secure 1st Precision with a 972-24X while Kitchens mustered a 964-31X to take 2nd Precision over Bowels 953-25X 3rd Precision finish.

In the factory class, Bob Morris and Steve Hickom, both using Kimber 82G's and Alan Rauber and his BSA





dominated, with Morris and Rauber both posting first stage 250's with Rauber only one point back. With additional targets fired, Paul Lemley, using a CZ452, made a great effort to break into the top three, but could quite compete against the 82G's. Morris fourth card was a second 250, easily securing 1st Factory honors with a 994-35X over Hickom and Rauber who took 2nd and 3rd Factory respectively. The dominance of the 82G did cause some concern and as a result, the Kimber 82G will be classified as a Precision class rifle for future matches.

High Power Rifle - Reloading Simplified

In a previous High Power Rifle article, we discussed the need for "decent ammunition" at ranges beyond about 200 yards. Just what is "decent ammunition" and why do we need it? I have worked in the manufacturing engineering business for many years. My focus has always to simplify manufacturing processes and make them repeatable. Let's try to simplify reloading...

At some point in your shooting, you are going to improve to the limits of your rifle and ammunition. This means that no matter how hard you work and how much you practice,



your rifle and ammunition will only shoot so well. This can be frustrating, so it is important to understand whether the problem is the gun, the ammo or the shooter. The most expensive store bought "match ammo" isn't that great. You could be paying \$2+ a round for ammunition that is run on automated loading machinery at fairly high production rates. Critical variables such as powder charge and case mouth tension can be all over the place. Contrast this with your own \$.60 hand loads, where case mouth tension and power charge are exactly the same.




You don't have to load ammo hot to be very accurate. In fact, the most accurate loads are usually well below published maximum powder charges. Published reloading data from Sierra and Lyman are a great place to start. What matters the most is safety and consistency. You want each round in a batch to be safe and exactly the same. Consistent ammo, along with an established zero, will allow you to work on your shooting technique. You will now be able to fine tune your body position, sight alignment and trigger control. Scores will start going up!

Decent ammunition starts with good quality brass. Supply issues over the past few years have been a big

problem, so sourcing reloading components can be challenging. The key thing to remember about sourcing brass is that you should use the same manufacturer and head stamp for all your reloads. Once fired, resized and trimmed, brass will be very consistent. I have used stock RCBS sizing and seating dies and a Wilson hand trimmer for many years with great results.

Most experienced high powers shooters tend to favor Sierra and Berger bullets, but there are many other great bullets out there, all with lots of published loading data. Sierra and Berger bullets are very consistent in weight and size from batch to batch, with excellent ballistic performance. Either will easily hold the X ring on your target (or the target next to you).

Powder and primers have been our biggest sourcing challenge recently. Keep looking and if you find what you need, try to buy in quantity. This costs more up front, but saves you having to develop new loads when you run out of your favorite flavor.



Shoot Ben Franklin's 100 yard match and ask other shooters where they are sourcing their supplies (and bad jokes).

I think the message I am trying to convey here is that an average hand load is far better than the best factory ammo. You not only save money, but your scores will go up and you can concentrate on improving your shooting technique. Pay attention to quality and safety, but **do not obsess**. This will let you to spend more time at the range. Always a "win-win" situation!

Bench Tech—Chapter 6: How to Strategically Full-Length Resize Rifle Brass with a Full-Length Resizing Die

Due to our country's legal environment, your receipt of this article and any use you make of the information in this article are subject in every respect to the limitations and conditions language at the end of the article.

As I discussed in Chapter 5, I believe that strategically full-length resizing rifle brass is fundamental for crafting accurate ammunition. The following procedural steps describe my notion of "strategic". As I have repeatedly stated (and will continue to do so), I make no claim that these steps constitute "best "practice. They simply represent my path of least resistance and help produce target results compatible with my accuracy performance expectations.

The following procedure assumes the full-length resizing die (FLRSD) has been adjusted in the reloading press to produce satisfactory "cam-over" of the linkage at full stroke of the press's ram. Such an adjustment accommodates a slight compression interference fit of the threads. Slightly compressing the threads of the die into the threads of the press prior to final cinching of the lock ring during setup "squares" the die to enhance coaxial alignment.

The word "strategic" means that both the brass reference length adjustment and the subsequent measurement of that adjustment are accomplished in units of 0.001 inch. The tools used to make these measurements are shown in Picture 6-1. The equipment used to control the reference resizing length (distance from the case's base to an arbitrary reference point on its shoulder) is shown in Picture 6-2.

Picture 6-1 shows a digital caliper accurate to 0.001 inch. A dial caliper accurate to 0.001 inch can also be used. The top-most tool assembly includes a gunsmith-machined, custom bump gage and an off-the-shelf anvil that can be fastened to the caliper's jaws. The machined bump gage is a segment from a discarded rifle barrel that has been faced on both ends. A case reamer has been used on one end to cut out the shoulder area of the case (300 Win shown) that is to be measured.

The lower-most tool assembly is an off-the-shelf headspace kit that can also be fastened to the caliper's jaws. The kit includes interchangeable plugs (gray cylinder) with various diameter holes that can be fitted over the brass case that is to be measured. As shown, the plug rests on an arbitrary refence point on the case's shoulder based on the diameter of the plug's hole. If this off-the shelf tool is used, I strongly recommend that an anvil be attached to a caliper jaw to uniformly/consistently support the case during measurements.

I believe the off-the-shelf head space tool shown is simple, economical, and effective. There are other off-the-shelf headspace tools that can be considered. As you may have expected, the custom-machined bump gage is preferred.

Picture 6-2 shows a set of off-the-shelf "competition" shell holders as well as an off-the-shelf FLRSD that has been customized with off-the-shelf components. The set includes a total of five precision-machined shell holders that fit specific case classes. The base thickness of these shell holders is machined at a thickness progressively increasing at 0.002- inch increments to strategically shorten the case to the desired value.

The expander ball shown on the decapping pin is carbide, offered as an additional-cost option by this particular manufacturer. I highly recommend the use of a carbide expander ball. Its use virtually eliminates galling of the case neck's interior. Such galling scores the copper jacket of the bullet during seating and can cause some variation in neck tension.

The locking ring/cap screw assembly is in response to what occurred in Picture 6-3. The manufacturer-supplied lock ring/brass set screw furnished with its 358 Win FLRSD had insufficient a\$\$ to prevent the die from slipping within the ring. This slippage caused the cases to be resized about 0.006 inches shorter than the target length. Regardless of my crafting/quality-control ineptitude, Picture 6-3 is graphic testimony for what can happen with an inappropriately adjusted resizing die that produces "too much" headspace reduction.

The following procedural use of the competition shell holders results in iterative/incremental steps necessary to achieve a headspace that is "just right". The following procedure is for bolt-action and leveraction rifles. The procedure for semiautomatic gas guns is subsequently presented.

- Measure the reference case length of multiple cases that require resizing to the nearest 0.001 inch. Use the tools shown in Picture 6-1 or a headspace measuring tool of your choice. Take your time. Be sure. Be precise. Thousandths of an inch matter. Expect some modest (at least 0.001 inch) variation of reference length measurement among the case candidates.
- Identify and segregate several of the "longest" cases for resizing trials.
- Install the FLRSD in the press and tighten it down.
- Insert the ".010" shell holder into the press's ram.
- Lube the trial case, insert it into the shell holder, and resize the case.
- Wipe/clean the lube from the case.
- Measure the reference length of the resized case. The case's reference length may or may not have been reduced. Even if it hasn't, gently attempt to chamber the case. (Lightly grease locking lugs, as appropriate, prior to any attempt at chambering)
- If the case chambers without wrestling with the bolt or lever, you have found perfection and should have heard angelic choirs burst into song. For a subjective assessment of "wrestling", chamber a currently resized case for comparison. If you still believe that no wrestling has occurred, you are done. Use the ".010" shell holder to resize all brass fired from that particular chamber. Go out and buy a lottery ticket 'cause you're livin' well beyond "right".
- 99.9% of you ain't livin' right (or right enough) to be done with a strategic case resize. Resist the urge to wrestle with the bolt or lever. You are merely at the first step of the iterative resizing process.

- Remove the "0.010" shell holder and insert the ".008" shell holder. Relube, resize, reclean, remeasure, reattempt to (gently) rechamber, and reassess "wrestling".
- The procedure's objective now becomes identifying the shell holder that first produces n0-drama chambering while shortening the reference case length no more than 0.002 inches. If the ".008" shell holder has not produced this desired result, continue the described process with each progressively decreasing-number shell holder until this objective is achieved.

Hot Tip: Those of you that can remove the firing pin/spring assembly from your bolt have added benefit, as it becomes ridiculously easy to assess ease of chambering. With a "properly" resized case, you can literally feel the subtle, final progressive cinching of the case in the chamber due to engagement of the bolt's locking lugs.

The same iterative procedure should be used for gas-gun brass. However, gas guns offer no tactile way to assess "bolt wrestling". Furthermore, the case must "absolutely" chamber. As such, I recommend that the target resize reference length be at least 0.003 inches shorter than the fired length, but no more than 0.004 inches to facilitate brass longevity.

For the few of you who really ain't livin' right, it is possible that use of the "0.002" shell holder will not produce a resized case that indicates it has been sufficiently bumped back/chambers without drama. The recourse is simple but aggravating (welcome to my world). Remove the die and the attendant lock ring and take the die to a machine shop. Have the die shortened by facing the end that accepts the case. A recommended amount is 0.006 inches.

Other dies are capable of full-length resizing rifle brass besides a FLRSD. Discussion of those dies and how they can be used is another topic with its own dedicated chapter(s). Hmmmm....I wonder what Chapter 7 will be about....
