Physical Infrastructure Improvements

During the monthly Board Meeting on September 13, 2021, the Board of Directors approved several improvements to the club's access roads and ranges. The projects approved will allow easier range use and access, will increase convenience for members and guests and will allow easier access to ranges by maintenance and emergency vehicles, especially during inclement weather.

Some of these projects are already complete and the rest have been scheduled during the month of October during weekdays when they will present a minimum of inconvenience for members and guests. Specific ranges will be temporarily closed during paving and concrete work and will be marked with a "Range Closed" sign. Please do not attempt to enter a range marked with a "Range Closed" sign. Details and scheduling appear below. Some scheduling may require adjustment due to contractor schedule changes and/or weather conditions.

Paving Projects

All paving is scheduled for October 11 through 15.

Part 1 – Pave access road to 22 Rimfire Rifle Range

Part 2 – Pave access road to Centerfire Rifle Silhouette Range

Part 3 – Pave Centerfire Rifle Silhouette Range road extension behind the firing line

Part 4 – Pave access road to Bullseye Pistol Range



Grading of Centerfire Plinking Range Bays 1 and 2

All grading was completed on September 24, 2021.

- Grading Bays 1 and 2
- Spread three loads of #5 gravel to cover stabilize soil on bays and adjacent roadway.

Concrete Work

All concrete work is scheduled for the week of October 4 through 8.

- Pour two 8' x 10' concrete pads, one each at firing lines on Centerfire Plinking Range bays 1 and 2.
- Pour two 8' x 10' concrete pads, one each at firing lines on Action Pistol bays 4 and 5.
- Pour one 10' x 12' concrete pad at entry gate near the flag pole and information kiosk.
- Remove cracked concrete pad on the Rimfire Plinking Range and pour one 10' x 20' reinforced concrete pad to replace it.

Assistant Chief Range Officer II Needed

River Bend Gun Club needs two additional ACRO II employees to help patrol ranges, answer questions, provide assistance to members and guests, collect sign in sheets and various other administrative tasks, as required. This is a part time job with a flexible schedule that pays \$18.00 an hour to start.

For people with an outgoing personality who enjoy helping others and making friends, the ACRO II job is quite rewarding. The club does not currently have enough employees working on the Chief Range Officer (CRO) Team to adequately handle the number of members and guests who use the various ranges, especially on weekends and holidays. If you want to help the club and its members and guests, if you enjoy working with others and you can work for a few hours on a couple of weekends per month, the club needs you.

The job description and instructions for who to contact and how to apply follow:

Job Description Assistant Chief Range Officer II (ACRO II)

River Bend Gun Club continues to seek <u>club members</u> who meet the qualifications for the ACRO II job as described below. This is an hourly position with flexible hours that pays \$18.00 per hour.

Mission Statement:

The mission of the Assistant Chief Range Officer II (ACRO II) is to consistently demonstrate a professional and courteous demeanor while representing the club, Club Management and the Board of Directors to members and guests. The ACRO II is required to support the Chief Range Officer (CRO) and Assistant Chief Range Officer (ACRO) in public relations activities with members and guests, to patrol the shooting ranges and club property, to ensure that the RBGC Range Rules are adhered to by all members and guests and to perform assigned administrative duties as required.

Job Duties:

- 1. Work approximately 30 to 40 hours per month including at least four weekend days and two to three weekdays per month. Hours and days worked are flexible depending on individual situations.
- 2. Patrol RBGC shooting ranges and club property.
- 3. Gather all sign in sheets from all ranges monthly.
- 4. Interface with members and their guests as necessary to answer questions, provide needed information, enforce the Range Rules and provide additional assistance as required.
- 5. Conduct the physical range tour portion of the monthly New Member Orientation for perspective new members.
- 6. Conduct monthly Tactical Rifle certification clinics.
- 7. Work as a coach for instructional events such as Women On Target.
- 8. Prepare written reports of observed and reported rule violations

Job Requirements:

- 1. <u>Applicants must possess well developed interpersonal skills</u> that enable them to interface with members and their guests in a professional, courteous and friendly manner whether they are offering assistance or are discussing Range Rules violations.
- 2. Applicants must be mature and level headed enough to remain professional when interacting with members

- and their guests who may become condescending, belligerent or confrontational.
- 3. Applicants must possess a thorough understanding of RBGC Range Rules, shooting range operations and must possess a broad working knowledge of different action types and firearms operation.

Organizational Structure:

The ACRO II reports directly to the CRO. In addition, the ACRO II is expected to maintain a close working rapport and communication with the ACRO, the Club Manager, the Shotgun Hill Manager, the Club President and members of the Board of Directors.

Instructions:

Applicants interested in the ACRO II position should submit their resume to Jim Garner, Club CRO at cro@rbgc.org

Resumes must include candidate contact information including an email address and phone number, a description of shooting related qualifications, a detailed employment history for the past ten years and a summary of education completed. Questions regarding ACRO II job responsibilities or the application process should be directed to Jim Garner via email at cro@rbgc.org and may also be asked during the interview.

Interviews with qualified candidates are pending and will be scheduled as soon as resumes are received. All qualified candidates will be notified of their interview date, time and location in advance.

Official Club Business

Highlights of the August 9, 2021 Board of Directors Meeting

President Will Owensby presided over a quorum of six Board members. Also attending were three club officers, the Club Manager, and the Assistant Club Manager. The meeting was convened at 7:00PM on Monday, August 9, 2021. The meeting was held at RBGC's Gene Mowell Conference Center on club property.

A quorum was confirmed, the proposed agenda was amended and adopted, the minutes of the July 12, 2021 Board meeting were approved, and the following officer and manager reports were presented and accepted:

Treasurer Secretary Chief Range Officer Club Manager Shotgun Manager

Board decisions made, actions taken, and items of interest:

- Treasurer Geoff Rhines reported that July FYTD income was \$573K, an increase of approximately \$79K versus the same period in FY 2020.
- July FYTD expense was \$82K, a decrease of approximately \$1K versus the same period in FY 2020.
- Cash in the bank as of 7/31/21 was \$576,851 including \$100,207 in Capital Reserve Fund.
- Club Secretary Erica D'Amico reported that the membership total at the beginning of the August 2021 meeting was 2,064.
- The number of Senior Members in August 2021 was 183 (8.7% of RBGC membership).
- There are currently 22 members on the Life Membership Wait List.
- Chief Range Officer Jim Garner presented the CRO report and reported that 20 of 20 venues submitted Match Use Summary Reports for July. Total entries were 607 (211 members, 382 non-members, and 12 juniors). July match income was \$26,490 with \$2,033 reported to the club.
- Range Use Summary Report for July totaled 1,882 (1,597 members and 285 guests).
- There was a New Member Orientation (NMO) class held on July 27 for 25 of the 29 registered attendees.
- There were 9 Tac Rifle Certifications in July.
- Wes Staton was approved as Hunting Rifle ARO.
- Club Manager Bill Illg reported that Galloway Construction and Consulting has completed the expansion of the Shotgun Hill Club House.
- A tree was removed that fell into the Rimfire Plinking Range.
- The Wayne Taylor Sporting Clays sign has been installed on the Sporting Clays Range.
- All first aid boxes were checked and replenished.
- The archery backboards were replaced and new targets have been hung.
- The damaged plate rack on CF Plinking 2 has been removed. Another plate rack will be installed in a few weeks.
- Assistant Club Manager Greg Hughes reported on behalf of Shotgun Hill Manager Bill Wettingfeld that shotgun range use in July was 459 shooters (402 members and 57 guests). 1,572 rounds were fired during the month with 29 cart rentals. Total July revenue to the club was \$9,761.
- The Board approved 15 new members.
- Facilities Committee Chairman Art Thompson reported that they have sent out bids for paving project on July 29 and they are due August 20. The committee will have final price by September board meeting.
- Insurance Committee Chairman Geoff Rhines reported that the club's current coverage ends 8/17/21. Reviewing potential new carrier.
- Public Relations Committee Chairman David Norcross reported that the August Bullet-IN reached 2,118 recipients. Open rate was 61% and 29% of members clicked through the newsletter.
- Scholarship Committee Chairman Ernie Knoche reported that \$9,500 has been received in renewal donations.
- Training Committee Chairman Jerry Rioux reported that going forward there will be one training class per month. It has been determined that the main interest in training is for basic classes.

- Will Owensby reported that the Young Shooters Challenge registration went live at 9AM on August 1, and had 120 registered for the event by 3:24PM and is now full. There are currently 42 volunteers registered for this event.
- On Saturday, August 7, at 11AM a Georgia Power contractor had a helicopter with a saw blade flying overhead within a few feet of guests on ranges to cut trees. The match had to be stopped and participants had to stand in front of the bays. The helicopter also had to land to refuel. RBGC was not notified of any work to be performed by Georgia Power on August 7. Per the RBGC agreement with Georgia Power, Georgia Power is not supposed to perform maintenance on property on Saturdays and without prior notice. The RBGC attorney and Georgia power will be contacted regarding the dangerous nature of the event on August 7, 2021.

Regular monthly Board meetings are called to order at 7:00 PM on the second Monday of each month in the Gene Mowell Conference Center. RBGC members and families are cordially invited to attend.

The other notable aspect of the sling competition was the monthly battle for dominance between Doug McNash and Matthew Whitley, who, as usual, were barely separated when the final results were tallied, with Doug prevailing by a single point.

Light Rifle Match Report

With a pair of cool dry days leading up to Labor Day, there were high hopes for moderate dry and comfortable conditions at the September Light Rifle match. What materialized from those hopes? Soup. As in very muggy cool but soupy conditions. The early rain and mist didn't stop 14 steadfast competitors from attending the match, including one new shooter.

Still conditions started the first stage, with Simon Bailey jumping out to a slim lead over Bob Morris based on center shots with Bailey's 93-2X just edging out Morris's 93-0X. George Wilson and Mauro Bisiacchi were tied in third place with a pair of 91-0's. First time program shooter Dennis Radek fired a very solid 85-1X on his first competition target. King Stracke and David Massengill fired 89's while the Junior Massengill, Xander, fired an 87.

Consistency proved to be the key to the day although good individual stages did help keep some shooters in the fray by overcoming their unwelcome weak stages.

In the second stage, Morris, Wilson, Massengill and Bisiacchi all posted between 88 and 91 while Bailey and Stracke didn't do quite as well, seemingly slipping out of contention, by firing an 85 and an 82 respectively. A welcome cooling breeze rose by stage three which saw Wilson and Morris again shooting consistently, while Bailey set what would turn out to be a match high 94-2X, to help move him back into contention. Bisiacchi had an unfriendly stage, posting a 79-0X while both Massengill's continued to shoot consistently keeping them in contention for class honors.

The fourth stage saw Wilson drop back a bit posting an 85, Bailey only managed an 80 while Morris maintained first place with an 89-1X. Both Stracke and Bisiacchi fired in the low 90's bolstering their positions. The Massengill boys slipped just slightly but still posted consistent scores in the upper 80's.

Consistency did finally reign in the final two stages as Morris finished with a pair of 91-0's to secure first place, Bailey managed a pair of 87-0's to secure third sandwiching Wilson in second place just four points ahead of Bailey.

Bisiacchi fired an 88-1X to finish 1st Sharpshooter. Xander Massengill ended on a strong 88-0X to secure 1st Master while Father David finished as 1st Marksman with a 522-1X.

Rimfire Benchrest Match Report

Simon Bailey

The final Rimfire Benchrest match of the season saw 15 competitors gather under gray skies and muggy, but still, conditions. The firing started with a 15 minute practice period prior to the start of the real action.

Only two Semiautomatic class shooters were on hand, the husband and wife team of Paul and Angelina Lemley. Both were using Brownell's action rifles with a 16" KSA barrel on



Angelina's rifle and an 18" on Paul's. Angelina put her rig to good effect, besting husband Paul on the first card with a very solid 246-5X.

Six competitors were shooting in the Factory class, with Drew McKay jumping out to his usual lead using his Lithgow 101 and posting a 249-11X. Bob Morris using his Kimber 82G fired a 248-8X to keep McKay within reach while Alan Rauber and his BSA International used his Wolf ammo to post a 246-3X.

In the seven person Unlimited class, Pat Patterson started out by posting a clean card using his X-III/Muller rig and Eley Match to put a 250-18X on the board. Joe Ettershank fired Center-X through his Anschutz 1927 fired a 248-7X to move to second. Three shooters posted 246's – Grant Toman 18X, Simon Bailey 14X and Dave Rabin 13X.

The second card simply tightened the scores even more. In Semiauto, Paul came back with a 245-5x, but remained one point behind Angelina. In Factory, Morris fired another 248-8X while





McKay fired a 247-6X to maintain the lead by only 1X tied at 496. Neal Shadden, using his Savage, posted a solid 247-8X to move into a tie with Rauber separated only by X's – 12 for Shadden and 7 for Rauber.

In Unlimited class, Patterson fired a 248-18X to maintain 1st place while Ettershank fired his second 248 (this time with 18-X's) to maintain second place. Toman fired a 249-16X to move to third place while Bailey, Rabin and John McBrayer all fired 248's to tie for fourth.

The winds, by now variable and frustrating, continued to cost points, but overall, the conditions were readable. Still, odd things did happen, with several unexpected high shots being reported along the line.

On the third card, Paul Lemley fired a second 245 to move 5 points ahead of Angelina, while McKay returned to 249 form putting a second 249-11X on the board to separate from Morris who managed a 246-11X. Rauber and Shadden also separated as Rauber posted a 244-7X to Shadden's 242-7X.



In Unlimited, Toman fired a clean 250-23X, yes, 23X – to move to within one point of Patterson who fired a 248-16X. Bailey put in a 248-18X to move into a tie with Ettershank for third as Ettershank fired a 246-12X. Robert Powers posted a very solid 249-16X – a personal best.

At the very end of firing the third card, the threatened rain finally arrived and resulted in about a 40 minute delay. As the rain tapered

off, the fourth cards were hung, and firing resumed just as the rain ended. With the very still conditions caused by the rain, high scores were expected.

Angelina excelled on the last card posting a 249-7X to overcome Paul's 242-5X and end the match in 1st place by two points. This was her first ever match win and she took home family bragging rights! McKay and Morris both scored 248's – McKay with 10-X's and Morris with 8, leaving McKay the Factory class winner by 3 points.





In Unlimited class, Toman slipped horribly only managing a 250-22X – yes, he slipped 1X from the last card – to secure first place with an aggregate 995 -79X over Patterson whose 247-15X left him two points back in second place. Bailey managed a 247-14X to squeak out a third place 989-58X.

At the conclusion of the match and after the scoring and tabulating was complete the finish positions were announced, and the prize money was awarded. Everybody agreed that it was a great match to end the season.
